## HISTORY

Even before Swami Vivekananda founded the Belur Math in 1898, he wanted to establish a Math for women with the Holy Mother Sri Sarada Devi at its centre. Based on his ideals, it was during the Holy Mother's Birth Centenary, that Sri Sarada Math came into existence on **2 December, 1954**. In **1960**, the Trustees of Sri Sarada Math founded the **Ramakrishna Sarada Mission Association** with the object of propagating educational, cultural, charitable, medical and similar activities among women and children.

Through the headquarters at Dakshineswar, Kolkata and its various centers in different parts of India, the Ramakrishna Sarada Mission seeks to serve women and children in all possible ways, irrespective of caste, creed, colour and nationality. At present, the Math and Mission run about 30 centres in different parts of India and abroad.

Ramakrishna Sarada Mission Vivekananda Vidyabhavan, a partly residential degree college for women, was the **first educational institution** started by the Ramakrishna Sarada Mission. It came into existence in **1961** as a humble effort to carry out Swami Vivekananda's ideas of education among women. The inaugural meeting to set up the college took place at the **30 bigha plot donated by Late Debendra Nath Bhattacharya**, on 10th March 1961; these beautiful grounds later become the college campus. The meeting was presided over by **Most Revered Swami Madhavananda Maharaj**, the General Secretary of the Ramakrishna Math and Mission. Housed initially in a one room makeshift structure, with thirty-one students and handful of young, idealistic and enthusiastic teachers and monastic members, the college today stands among the premier women's institutions of the state.

### AIMS AND OBJECTIVES

"The uplift of the women...must come first and then only can any real good come about for country, for India." – Swami Vivekananda

Education, according to Swami Vivekananda, is not the amount of information that is put into one's brain, and undigested, runs riot there. In his opinion, the balanced combination of secular and spiritual training constitutes the true economics of education.

Ramakrishna Sarada Mission Vivekananda Vidyabhvan is founded on the ideals of Swamiji. "It is not possible for a bird to fly on only one wing," he felt. He believed that society cannot progress depending on men alone. It has to harness female power too.

The college marks a bold departure from the existing pattern of educational institutions. It provides a peaceful academic environment, ideal for pursuit of studies. Here, the

students are placed under the direct supervision and care of dedicated teachers and monastic members of Sri Sarada Math and Mission.

The system enables the students to come into intimate contact with the teachers and to receive an all-round education in an atmosphere of serenity, peace, discipline and morality. The institution helps to nurture and strengthen the physical, intellectual, moral, and spiritual faculties of students. The college does not believe in churning out good students defined solely by academic results, but aims at building confident and self – reliant human beings with human principles and a strong sense of responsibility towards society. It works toward creating an ideal society based on the principles of equality, freedom, justice, tolerance, and respect for religious diversity and moral values, emphasized in the constitution of India.

In order to further the vision of self-reliance and strive towards the cause of women's empowerment, the College has recently started the **School of Professional Studies**. Under its aegis, RKSMVV offers a bouquet of add-on professional courses.

## LOCATION

The college is located at 33, Sri Maa Sarada Sarani, Dum Dum, Kolkata 700055. The sprawling 30-bigha campus is situated in green and picturesque surroundings, a welcome refuge from the din and bustle of city life. It is 15 minutes away from the nearest metro stations-Belgachhia and Dum Dum, and is connected to both by regular bus and auto-services. The bus routes include 3C, 3C/1, 3C/2, 30, 30D, 79B, 79C, 93, 221, 223, 219, 227, DN8 and DN18 (Bus Stop: Jessore road - Dum Dum Park and Shyamnagar).

### RULES AND REGULATIONS

Every student must conform to rules and discipline of college and hostel. The insistence on strict discipline is to help the students develop their potentialities in an orderly way, to promote a healthy relationship between the teachers and students, and to create and preserve a peaceful academic atmosphere. However, love and mutual respect always remain the guiding principles and basis of obedience.

### COLLEGE

1. Every student must abide by the rules of the college.

2. A prayer assembly is held daily at 10.05 am before the commencement of the classes. Attending the assembly is compulsory for all students.

3. It is compulsory for all students to come to the college in college uniform.

4. The students should be regular and punctual in attendance.

5. A minimum of 60% attendance is mandatory to be allowed to appear for the University exams.

6. In case of prolonged absence, the Principal is to be intimated within a week.

7. Attendance in the unit tests and other class examinations is compulsory.

8. It is compulsory for the students to be present in the college from 10a.m. to 2.30p.m. No student is allowed to leave the college premises during the working hours of the college without the permission of Principal.

9. The students are expected to cooperate with the College Authority to maintain the cleanliness of the college premises.

10. College discipline is to be strictly maintained.

11. Ramakrishna Sarada Mission Vivekananda Vidyabhavan is an institute under the Ramakrishna Sarada Mission, which is a non-political organization. The students of the institution must keep away scrupulously from all political activities within the college premises.

12. All students have to attend a weekly special Class devoted to study of Indian culture and religion, with assignments and examinations.

### ✤ HOSTEL

Ramakrishna Sarada Mission Vivekananda Vidyabhavan is a partly residential college, and the hostel forms an integral part in its scheme of imparting an all-round education. Run on the system of the ancient "GURUKUL", it pays special attention to the cultivation of those aspects of the students' personality, which are otherwise neglected in a conventional system.

The boarders are housed in two spacious buildings - Bharati Bhavan and Brahmananda Bhavan. The resident Superintendent, a monastic member of the order, is in charge of hostel, under the supervision and guidance of the Principal. Here, under the love and sincere care of resident monastic members, the students receive an all-round training in an atmosphere of peace, discipline and purity.

1. The boarders are required to bring the following items at the time of admission:

i. Bedding, including bed sheet, bed cover and mosquito-net.

ii. Plate-1

iii. Glass-1

iv. Bowl-1

v. Cup and saucer-1

vi. Jug-1

vii. Umbrella-1

viii. Torch-1

ix. Bucket and mug-1

x. Xerox copies of S.F and H.S. admit Card and Marksheets

2. The boarders are taught to be self-reliant, active, and efficient, and responsible. They are entrusted with various duties and responsibilities not only in the hostel, but also in the shrine, the garden, and the sick-rooms.

3. The aim of Ramakrishna Sarada Mission Vivekananda Vidyabhavan is to impart value-based education to its students. Accordingly, it is compulsory for the boarders to join in the morning and evening prayers daily at hostel prayer hall. They also have to attend the regular religious classes held for them in the hostel. The boarders also organize various socio-religious functions and actively participate in periodical religious celebrations of Sri Sarada Math.

4. All students must strictly adhere to prescribed schedule for study, work and prayer.

5. A student is not allowed to be absent from class and stay back at the hostel unless she is physically unfit or is specially permitted by the Principal.

6. No visitors are allowed during college hours.

7. It is compulsory for a student to be present on the day the college and hostel reopen after any vacation. Failure may lead to an imposition of fine.

8. Boarders are allowed to go home only during the long vacations, i.e. the Summer Vacation and Puja Vacation. For any other leave, a letter from the guardian is necessary for permission to leave the hostel.

9. In case of serious illness, especially in case of contagious diseases like measles, chicken pox, mumps, etc, the local guardian should take the boarder away immediately from the hostel to avoid further infection.

10. Boarders are advised not to carry money or valuables with them. Personal cash may be deposited with the superintendent. The must be careful about all their belongings including books and other valuables.

11. It a student's progress in studies is found to be unsatisfactory by the college authority, she will not be allowed to continue her studies in this institution, or to stay in the hostel.

## LIBRARY

The Ramakrishna Sarada Mission Vivekananda Vidyabhvan Library is located in a separate building with a spacious reading room extensively used by faculty and students. Apart from the large holding of books, journals and magazines, the library also houses an Internet Resources Centre with printing facilities for student and faculty.

## FACILITIES

- The Central Library has a collection of over 23,000 books, 40 journals, and access to several online databases catering to the academic needs of the students and the faculty.

- The library catalogue is fully computerized.
- The library subscribes to INFLIBNET. The students and faculty members can access more than 6000 e-journals and 97,000 e-books from <a href="http://nstl.inflibnet.ac.in">http://nstl.inflibnet.ac.in</a>.
- The IRC provides free internet browsing for students and faculty members. Students can take print-outs for nominal fees.
- The library has the special section devoted to Gender resources. It is also currently building up a collaborative archive on the history of Sri Sarada Math and Mission and its Women Missionaries.
- Besides the central library, all Honours students enjoy the facilities of respective departmental seminar libraries and book-banks.

The library is open on all days except holidays, Puja and Christmas vacation.

### WORKING HOURS:

Mon to Fri: 10.15 a.m. to 4.30p.m.

Saturday: 10.15 a.m. to 4.00p.m.

- Users are allowed to carry only loose papers and a pen or pencil. All bags & personal belongings are to be kept outside the library.
- Books are issued to students on all days except Saturdays.
- Books lost or damaged by a user are to be replaced.

• Students are provided with two leading cards against which two books can be issued from the library, which are to be returned within 15 days. Overdue books incur a fine of Re 1/- per day.

## **REPROGRAPHIC AND INTETRNET FACILITIES**

The students can avail photo copying and internet facilities at the Reprographic Centre and the Cyber Room respectively.

## ACADEMIC ACTIVITIES

Apart from regular classes and tutorials, the college conducts regular Extension Lectures, Seminars and Educational Excursions.

## EXTRA -CURRICULAR ACTIVITIES

Extra-curricular activities are an integral part of college life. They make for academic excellence, apart from providing opportunities for all-round development and mental and physical relaxation. The teaching staff is fully integrated into the students' cultural and other extra-curricular work through several committees set up for this purpose.

## Cultural Competitions

Cultural competitions are an eagerly awaited annual affair, aptly named SRIJANI, spread over 4-5 days, offering students an opportunity to nurture and cultivate their talents and interests in such diverse fields as music, dance, painting, recitation, creative writing, debating, and oratory.

### Sports and Games

Regular training under a qualified Sports Teacher is conducted round the year for interested students. Annual sports are held in the college grounds every year in winter.

### Magazine and Wall-Magazine

Students' creativity is further demonstrated through the regularly published College Magazine and Wall Magazines put up by the students of various departments.

## Festival and Social Functions

Events like Vidyarthini Home and Nobin Baran, Vriksharopana Utsav, Independence Day Celebrations, Puja Social, Youth Day Celebrations, Annual Puja (Holy Mother's Birthday), Saraswati Puja, Alumni Reunion, Annual Function and Prize Distribution are organized by the college at different times of the year.

## Donation Drive

To include spirit of community service and sharing, donation drives are organized where students and faculty donate spare clothes, books, toys and other house hold and personal items. These are distributed among the underprivileged members of neighbourhood slums.

### Blood Donation & Awareness camps

Annual blood donation camps are organized in campus preceded by awareness cum orientation programmes on organ and blood donation.

### Gender Sensitization Programmes

The college regularly organizes awareness and training sessions on gender equality and sexual harassment.

NSS

The National Service Scheme (NSS) promotes social service and also instil ideas of social welfare, humanity, magnanimity and philanthropy amongst students. The college has quite a few underprivileged neighbourhoods around its vicinity, which were catered with provisions by the college itself so long, and now they have been taken under the wings of NSS-RKSMVV. A variety of campaigns and activities have since been conducted and held. The NSS kick started its innings with an Anti-Plastic campaign to arouse a consciousness amongst the underprivileged not just about the harmful ills of using plastic, but also about the options available to them instead.

A Blood Donation Orientation Camp was conducted prior to the blood donation camp, to address the various questions and prejudices, and pre-conceived notions relating to blood donation. A door-to-door Dengue campaign had been organized by the volunteers to create awareness.

The Menstrual Health and Hygiene Awareness Programme, a topic much ignored and most in need for attention, was conducted by the NSS team.

Even during the pandemic, the NSS, living by its motto, had come forward and selflessly served these communities, beginning with COVID awareness to supplying provisions that come under necessities; all of which had been carried out on behalf by the college monastics.

### MENTORING SESSION

Each student has a teacher mentor to guide them and help them in any of their problems.

### COLLEGE COUNSELLING CELL

1. With a view to extend support to students and help nurture their mental health, the College has set up a dedicated psychological counselling cell using the expertise and experience of the skilled teachers of the Psychology department. College has allotted 4 hours in a week for counselling session. The students in need or suggested by the teacher mentor can avail this facility.

2.Stress management workshops are organized in collaboration with Jadavpur University to address the students' academic and personal problems.

### MEDICAL AND COUNSELLING FACILITIES

2. Regular health awareness & medical camps are organized in collaboration with Ramakrishna Sarada Mission Matri Bhavan.

3. First-aid, limited medical diagnosis and medication are available on the campus.

4. Besides, there is a charitable dispensary run by experienced homoeopath doctors for students and women and children of the neighbouring slums.
